Where are we today?

We have come a long way since 2007 when we launched the world's first Mobile Chemotherapy Unit in Gloucestershire. As you read this, our newest Unit has just been launched in Cornwall so we now have 9 Units on the road. We are achieving our goal of bringing cancer treatment closer to home for chemotherapy patients in Gloucestershire, Somerset, South Wiltshire, Hampshire, East Kent, Berkshire, Lincolnshire, North Wiltshire and... Cornwall! There are more areas in the pipeline so why not visit our website to keep yourself up to date!

During our first Chemotherapy In the Community Week in December last year, we announced that we had saved patients and their carers over 500,000 miles of travel by bringing treatment closer to them; a fantastic achievement with your help and of course the number of miles saved increases every day the Units are out visiting the many community locations they cover.

The story doesn't finish once we have launched an MCU in an area. Post-launch, we begin fundraising to keep that Unit maintained and on the road and we continue in partnership with the NHS to ensure the success of the service. It costs about £12,000 per year to keep each Unit on the road so our corporate, charitable trust and community supporters are invaluable to us. From a tea party in your garden, to a glitzy glamourous dinner or gruelling 'Tough Mudder', every fundraising event makes a difference as we strive to fulfil our vision of having a Mobile Chemotherapy Unit in every county in the UK.


Launch of 'Dorothy' our 9th MCU in Cornwall

On Friday 8th May the launch of 'Dorothy' took place at Royal Cornwall Hospital in Truro with many local dignitaries, members of the MCU medical team of The Royal Cornwall Hospitals NHS Trust, Hope for Tomorrow team, Trustees and Patrons and representatives from the Mark Benevolent Fund (who kindly funded the capital costs of this MCU) present to celebrate. Despite the best efforts of the rain, the launch was a huge success, with David Richards CBE being invited to cut the ribbon and name the Unit after his grandmother, who he has hugely fond memories of spending time with in Cornwall. David's speech touched many with the words:

"For most of us travelling around Cornwall is a pleasure with its wonderful scenery and coastline, but not necessarily for those suffering from cancer, whose regular journeys are of necessity for treatment at the Royal Cornwall Hospital in Truro. The availability of the county's first Mobile Chemotherapy Unit will make an enormous difference to these patients, relieving the stress of travelling to hospital and offering treatment closer to home."

MEET ONE OF OUR FUNDERS

In each issue we like to introduce you to the stories and people behind the scenes. John Prizeman is the President of the Mark Benevolent Fund (MBF) and to mark their 150th Anniversary in 2018, the MBF are funding a number of new Units, which will launch across the country.



Can you explain your role in the Mark Benevolent Fund (MBF)?: As President of the MBF I am appointed to serve as chairman of the MBF Board of Trustees of which there are twelve who freely, in every sense of the word, give their time and expertise to apply and distribute our funds in accordance with the wishes of our members.

What made the MBF choose to support Hope for **Tomorrow and our MCU** project?: The MBF originally learnt of Hope for Tomorrow when our members in Wiltshire, Hampshire and Isle of Wight raised money to support their local MCUs. The trustees of the MBF were so impressed by the enthusiasm and support given in these Provinces that they commissioned a report to determine whether further nationwide support could be given. It was then agreed, that to celebrate the MBF 150th Anniversary in 2018, the Fund would make a phased major grant to HFT.

What do you like about being involved with our MCU project?: The MBF felt that HFT had inspirational leadership and was economically administered by a small devoted team with a proven track record in enabling NHS Trusts to operate a much needed chemotherapy facility in local communities.

How do you feel that supporting Hope for Tomorrow benefits the MBF?: We can be certain that our members generosity is providing a service to the community at large. Since launching our Sesquicentenary appeal our members have embraced the cause, they all know of a family member, friend, neighbour or work colleague who has required cancer treatment and all appreciate the benefit that a HFT Mobile Chemotherapy Unit can provide in the local

How much have you raised since the MBF was started nearly 150 years ago?: We have distributed in excess of twenty five million pounds to individual petitioners and worthy causes since being founded in 1868 by our then Grand Master The Rev George Raymond Portal.
