

Working in partnership with 11 NHS Trusts, our 12 mobile cancer care units and 10 nurse support vehicles provide chemotherapy and other treatments onboard. Since 2007, our units have welcomed thousands of patients across England. Last year, our fleet of units delivered over 29,000 patient treatments.

It costs us £212 per day to keep one of our mobile cancer care units on the road, treating on average 20 patients per day.

Help us to drive cancer care Forward

At Hope for Tomorrow, we believe that everyone should have a choice over the way they receive their cancer care treatment, whoever and wherever they are.

Hope for Tomorrow fundraises to develop, build, and maintain worldclass mobile cancer care units to support NHS patients by taking cancer care into their local communities. By having their treatment on board our units people living with cancer can maintain their independence and quality of life - saving time and money during a difficult time in their lives.

Your support will have a huge impact. It will enable us and our NHS Trust Partners to be there for people in real need. Our units:

- Reduce travel time for patients and the associated costs and stress of long lourneys to and from hospital
- Allow patients to keep their independence, ensuring their treatment doesn't dictate their lives
- Take the pressure off NHS cancer treatment waiting lists
- Increase capacity within the NHS by treating patients with less complex needs, meaning patients iwth more specialist treatment can be seen quickly within a hospital oncology centre









"I live quite a way from the hospital, in a village called Cam which is south of Gloucester. I much prefer the unit as I find it far less traumatic. Apart from saving on travel costs, it is far more serene and much calmer than on the wards with people rushing up and down. I'm 84, so it makes a big difference.

It was just a lot of hassle; with cancer, you're very tired anyway, so whatever you do knocks you back. I much prefer the atmosphere on the unit, you can talk to people whereas when you're in the hospital they don't always have the time as they're so busy and nobody tells you anything.

I understand that is just how it works, I feel I can ask questions. It seems to be a far calmer situation. It's quicker and more convivial, and time passes quickly
